(WASC) in accrediting Catholic schools. Our teachers and staff have already completed a Self Sudy document which the Visiting Committee will review. After the



review, the Committee will spend three days with the school community and also visit classrooms, investigate the written evidence of responses to the WCEA criteria, holds interviews with members of the school community, and prepare a written report on its findings. It will submit a recommendation of an accreditation status to the WCEA Commission. In May, the full WCEA Commission will read the report and vote for an accreditation status for the school. The school was last reaccredited in 2014 and received the longest period of accreditation awarded. We look forward to displaying to the Visiting Committee the excellence of education our teachers and staff provide, and to being accredited for another 6 years.
